


What next for 'The Preston Model'?

A democratic economy now emerging in Preston based on common sense alternatives

- Our anchor strategy has large placed based institutions in Preston and Lancashire with a combined spend of nearly £1 billion per annum increasing spending to local suppliers to benefit our community.
- £100m placed based investment by our public pension fund in student flats, hotel and office space through City Deal we wish to build on.
- Expansion of cooperative and employee owned businesses through Preston's Cooperative Development Network (Presco) with UCLan and others. Commitment to 'gap coops'.
- Commitment to establishing the Lancashire Community Bank and continued support for our credit union (Clevr) and CDFI (Lancashire Moneyline).
- Preston City Council is now an energy supplier through its partnership with a neighbouring authority — Fairerpower Red Rose.
- Opportunity for councils in Lancashire to establish a housing development role through a new housing company.




Public pension fund investments in Preston

OUTCOMES – Job density

In 2016 Preston was in the top 50 of UK local authority areas for job density (1.03 compared to the <u>UK average</u> of 0.84). Also in 2015-2016 Preston added 5% in GVA per head equivalent to £1,157.

- ✓ **Catering**: an existing leakage of £5,420,537.89 and 23 existing organisations in Preston;
- ✓ **Facilities & Management Services**: an existing leakage of £1,212,112.99 and 10 existing
- ✓ **Furniture & Soft Furnishings**: an existing leakage of £158,104.36 and 0 existing organisations in Preston.


- ✓ **Artificial Intelligence and Data Economy** to put the UK at the forefront of the artificial intelligence and data revolution

What next for coops and 'The Preston Model'

- Continue to form 'gap coops' to scale up to supply anchor institutions to prevent leakage from local economy.
- Explore utilising the community bank and other public investments to expand cooperative economy.
- Discuss formal relationship between Mondragon Cooperative Corporation and Preston's anchor institutions.
- Explore relationships between trade unions and Mondragon to launch 'union coops'.
- Reconsider work around 'succession planning' to encourage retiring business owners to sell to their workforce.
