|   | What is a postal vote?<br>When there is an election, instead of going to  |

|   | the polling station to vote, your ballot paper is<br>sent to your house. You can then vote at<br>home and post your vote back to us.  |
|   | If you have received a pink poll card then this<br>is telling you that you postal vote is on its<br>way.  |
|   | Royal Mail will deliver an envelope to your<br>house with your postal vote inside. Your area<br>may have a parish election so you will<br>receive two envelopes.  |
|   | Open your envelope.   |
|   | <ul> <li>Inside your envelope you will find:</li> <li>1) A postal voting statement which you need to fill in</li> <li>2) 1 Ballot paper (white). Electors who have a Parish election will have 1 green ballot paper.</li> <li>3) A brown envelope with the letter A on it</li> <li>4) A white envelope with the letter B on it</li> </ul> |

| NOTE FOR OUE CARENATE OVER       Year   | You can vote for no more than <b>one</b><br>candidate. In the Preston Rural East Ward<br>you can vote for no more than <b>two</b><br>candidates. To vote you need to put a cross<br>in the end column next to the name of the<br>person you want to vote for. |
| 1.   | Put the ballot papers with your cross on into brown envelope A.   |
| Lenner   | Seal the brown envelope A.  |
|  | Take the brown envelope A and put it into the white envelope B.   |
|  | Also, put the security statement, with your date of birth on, into the white envelope B.  |
|  | Make sure the address of the Town Hall is<br>showing in the window of the white envelope<br>so that Royal Mail know where to send your<br>vote.   |
| And the second s | <b>Check</b><br>Inside the white envelope B should be the<br>brown envelope A and your security<br>statement with your date of birth and<br>signature on.   |
|  | You can now seal the white envelope B.  |
|  | You have now completed your postal vote.  |
